

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Wales Rally GB 2013

The main event last month was the Wales Rally GB, on the Marshalling front we unfortunately had a reduced presence in the forest, instead of the usual dozen Marshalls, we had Paul Jeeves for supporting this premier event, well done Paul.

On the competition front myself and Rob Cook decided we could put a package together for this year's event as I enjoyed so much last year.

As the Car Spares Escort Mk11 is not currently homologated the only option was to enter in the National section. For this you still compete 99% of all the stages over the 3 days and cover the forest stages once, where the international crews cover the stages twice, with me so far.

This year we had ace Mechanic Ian Barnard with Simon & Anita Higgs duly secured as service crew.

The start of the National event was from the Toyota Factory Car park in Flintshire, we headed for the Industrial estate where the scrutinerring was taking place, scrutinerring done with no issues, then walked to the factory reception! for signing on.

This weekend saw the welcoming of the world's best rally drivers to the Welsh Forest's, WRC Wales Rally GB. On the National Rally front 100 cars were scheduled for the 2 or 3 day event of competition The stages of Wales Rally GB are renowned as some of the toughest in the world, on the bright side myself & Rob had tackled a number of them on the various BTRDA events we have entered in the pass.

Day one

After a long drive south to the Time control at Newtown, not expecting too much, was I mistaken the main high street was closed off to normal traffic 100's of spectators and camera's and all drivers were being interviewed on the start ramp, what a show. Into the refueling service point as by now we were low on fuel and we haven't competed on any forest stages yet. Eventually we arrived at Hafren and into the short Sweet Lamb stage. Driver error at the Water Splash Hair pin the Car Stalled and a handful of second was lost, across the road into Myherin we queued up for 45 mins as there was a delay, we got within 10 mins of starting when we were informed the stage was now cancelled, we were not

Back in the Service area, Ian & Simon and got about checking to the car over, with a wore front bottom ball joint it was decided to replace the offending joint, now we were ready for the Saturday stages in Mid Wales

Day two

The second day was better, another 5 stages, 2 runs of Gartheiniog, Dyfi, Dyfnant, then finally 2 runs of Chirk Castle spectator stage. but every stage was totally different from the other. though the stages were more cut up, rutted and bumpy in places. It was a lot dryer than the first day and each stage had a mixture of rock, fine gravel and tarmac which was very difficult to adapt to. The Chirk Castle stage after a nearly an hours delay in starting was now in the dark, luckily we forecast this and already had the spot lights on the car. This stage was only 1.8 miles long with a split to the finish. The

stage diagram which I remembered was straight to the finish, was I wrong should has listened to Rob, after a long excursion in going round the loop again we lost around 90 seconds dropping us from around 20th overall to 29th, not the end of world. Now a 50 mile road section back to service.

A spanner check a change of rear tyres which were totally shot. Ian did notice a oil leak at the front of the car, a closer inspection revealed the oil cooler was leaking from the inner core. On asking most of the service crews there was not a replacement to be found. The only solution was to bypass the cooler, cut the pipe unions from the pipe and weld them together. Easy really, thanks to John Taylor from Wickford Car Club for assisting in the operation. Now we were ready for day 3

The last day of Wales Rally GB was in North Wales with 6 stages totaling 32 miles, the first three forest stages were Dyfnant and Penllyn, and Clocaenog then two runs of Kinmel Park, then the grand finally the 4.6miles of the Great

Orme Stage

"I had a fair idea that it would be hard work to keep the car from sliding too much through the forest. The stages were more like mud tracks but drying out with each stage, so I had to fight with the car to keep it on line, with not too much over steer.

The Kimmel Park stage which was new to the Rally Wales being gravel tracks and muddy tarmac, the spectators were well entertained with a lot of sideways by the RWD Escorts, the Car spares Escort was no exception. At junction 4 at the hairpin there was a half meter hole which inflicted the only damage to the car by the way of the bottom half of the wheel arch, now a little dented.

"My only goal on the rally was to finish the event but when you're in the car there is so much going on it is easy to forget that. There were a few times during the weekend where my brain was totally fried, arriving at the stage finish unable to speak, with a mouth that had dried up and sweat pouring from my forehead, what fun !!!!!!. "The whole weekend just went like clockwork, the 35 year old Escort went faultless and did not miss a beat even if I did give it a thrashing. Rob was well in control of the pace notes, and did a fantastic job in the left hand seat just the driver had a few moments in unleashing all that power.

A big thanks to Ian, Simon & Anita Higgs in keeping the car mobile during the three days of competition, with the service area being far away from the stages at least thay got out to spectate during the day, and of course Car Spares of Cheshunt and Comma oils for their support.

Overall an enjoyable event and great atmosphere of the WRC, well onto the result for the Car Spares Escort came 28thth overall and 3rd in class. Having got the taste of this event may be back next year, it would be good for more GBMC members to compete on this 3 day event, it does not cost the earth ????

The first mention must be made regarding crash helmets, as I've had a few 'phone calls asking if their crash helmets will be valid or not for 2014. Helmets with the orange foil "Snell" sticker "SA2000", usually found inside the crash helmet behind the padding, may be withdrawn 1st January 2015,

and helmets with the red "BS 6658 Type A/FR" sticker, found on the outside of the crash helmet, may be withdrawn 1st January 2016...page 168 K10.3.1. If you think about it most of these crash helmets are going to be at least 15 years old!!! Also, questions were asked about the blue MSA sticker scrutineers place on the side of crash helmets. Please be assured, if the MSA sticker has a date printed on it, don't worry, the date is for when the inspecting scrutineer purchased the stickers from the MSA and when they were applied to the helmet. It does not say that your crash helmet is "out of date" or needs re-stickering.

Regarding seats in stage rally cars, previously stage rally cars that had been Competition Car Log Booked before 1st January 2009, could use "out of date" FIA seats. Those stage rally cars CCLB'd after 1st January 2009, had to use "in date" FIA homologated seats. After the MSA conducted extensive tests on new and old FIA homologated seats (the reports made interesting reading!!!), it was decided by the Rallies Committee to make "in date" FIA homologated seats mandatory for ALL stage rally cars regardless of when they were CCLB'd...from 1st January 2014. Although it's not mentioned in the 2014 Blue Book, a bulletin was published when the winter issue of MSA News was sent out.

For stage rally cars, if their engine oil systems breather system is NOT a closed loop system, a catch tank of at least a one litre capacity must now be incorporated in the oil breather system...page 312 R48.2.9. Previously it was ½ litre capacity so your old Coke bottle needs to be replaced with a 1 litre bottle!!!

Something that was brought to my attention on the recent Rockingham Stages, cars must now carry a suitable belt cutter...page 314 R48.10.11. I missed that one!!! On the subject of seat harnesses, I had a stage rally car presented to me for scrutineering for the Rockingham Stages. It was an immaculate BMW M3, it had just been completed and the competitor proudly gave me the CCLB receipt, having only been inspected a couple of days before the rally. I noticed that both sets of harnesses had 2" shoulder straps. On asking the competitor where their HANS devices and suitable crash helmets were, I was greeted with a negative response. I asked if the CCLB inspecting scrutineer had pointed out the narrow 2" belts could only be used with a HANS device, again I was given a negative response. Needless to say, I asked the competitor to remove the belts and replace them with 3" belts before they could start the rally, when another scrutineer said "Where does it say in the Blue Book you can't use 2" belts?" My Chief scrutineer and I reminded him that although it does not say in the Blue Book about width of shoulder straps, it does say that the harnesses have to be FIA homologated...page 313 R.48.10.4. The FIA web site says the harnesses

to be homologated; they must be in date and have a minimum of 77mm (3") width shoulder straps, unless if used with a HANS device, 2" harnesses can be used. (Why do we have 3" harnesses? It's to do with spreading the loadings on your shoulders.)

If your competition car is fitted with 2" shoulder straps and your type of competition requires 3" FIA harnesses, make sure you are using a HANS device with a suitable crash helmet. If not, you may be going home early if you've left your HANS device at home...harsh I know, but it's done to help protect you if you were unlucky to have an incident. Of course if you have a sprint car, your belts can be non-FIA homologated... road going classes etc. but it is strongly recommended to install and use FIA harnesses.

There has been some discussion regarding what tyres will be allowed for "unsealed surface" stage rallies.

From 1st January 2015, it is proposed to limit the type of tyres permitted on unsealed surface stage rallies; this is to reduce damage to road surfaces. At the moment the tyres allowed will be in Tyres List 6 and are subject to approval by the Tyre Advisory Panel (yes I know, I've just looked in the 2014 Blue Book, there isn't a list 6!!!Watch this space for bulletins etc).

MSA introduces revolutionary new coaching standard for motor sport

The creation of a new accredited coaching structure within UK motor sport has taken another major step forward after ten individuals were qualified as Level 2 motor sport coaches.

Pat Blakeney, Phil Glew, Jonny Kane, Calum Lockie, Tim Mullen, John Pratt, Oliver Rowland, Duncan Tappy, Jamie Wall and Danny Watts all successfully completed the intensive four-day MSA Level 2 Certificate in Coaching Performance Motor Sport, held at Mercedes-Benz World in Surrey last month.

The award is part of a revolutionary new coaching infrastructure that has been developed by the MSA in association with accredited qualifications body 1st4Sport and is in line with the UK Coaching Certificate framework.

"Firstly, this framework will raise standards across the board and provide a level of consistency that ensures a good experience for everyone at whatever level," said Ben Taylor, MSA Director of Development. "Secondly, it's about introducing an understanding of the role of coaching within our sport that will have a significant impact on our ability to create future champions. Thirdly, as the governing body of UK motor sport, the MSA has a duty of care to ensure that those responsible for coaching others are properly trained, assessed and accredited. And finally, there is a political benefit in that it puts the MSA and motor sport on the same footing as other governing bodies, which is essential if we are to confirm our place as a major sport."



To put this new framework in place, the MSA has been working closely with Professor Dave Collins, former Performance Director of UK Athletics. Together they have developed a structure that includes two Level 2 awards (one with a Performance focus, the other Participation), as well as an entry level
