Sadly that wasn't to be as I'll explain later.

The third Sunday in September is also the date of Middlesbrough Motor Club's annual Classic Motorcycle Show. The club is an odd one as it's only nominally a Motor Club, it is more of a social club and the Motor Club is actually a Motorcycle Club, which meets on a Monday evening at the club's beautiful old manor house. I am no a 'biker' but I do enjoy motorcycle racing and love old bikes so, as the clubhouse is in the next street to mine and being a member the event was in my diary as one to attend.

No problem, the show was to open at 10 a.m. and Croft is only half an hour away. At the beginning of September it was announced in the local paper that there was to be a classic car show at the Dorman's Club in Linthorpe-the village part of Middlesbrough, in aid of the Great North Air Ambulance. There were a couple of show there last year on their huge field and both got good turn outs of cars so I decided there and then to attend all three, reasoning that Coulby to Linthorpe is only ten minutes drive, given a traffic free run through Acklam

I am very lucky to have Croft circuit virtually on my doorstep and was there in half an hour via Acklam Road, the A19 and A66 round Darlington.

On Sunday no engines are allowed before noon and I had plenty of time for a walk round the paddock and I made straight for paddock 'C' where the touring cars lurked. I was both delighted and dismayed at the same time. Delighted because there was quality, some lovely historics; a couple of Anglias, Steven Spriggs much photographed Cortina, a brace of moggie thousands with 1275 engines and a Triumph 2000. In one ofthe races for more modern cars the star was the ex-Tim Harvey 1986 SD1 Rover, still in Istel colours, alongside a Dolomite, a Capri and an Escort.

Dismayed because of the lack of numbers. I knew, thanks to Robert Taylor, that Malcolm wouldn't be there because his car's engine was in bits but when I found the entries for his race I found that there were only six starters, a motley collection of five well used beemers and a lost looking Fiesta. They were grouped with the four starters from the Pre 2005 Production Car Series.

At times at Croft this season we've struggled for entries, especially in any series which is not for just one make, I've seen our own Northern Sports Saloon series have only six starters, in three classes! It's becoming Like Alice in Wonderland's caucus race, every starter wins their class.

I had put this down to the economy but actually it must be that there are simply too many championships, when the Classic Saloons race had nine starters, the Classic Thunder had eight starters- in six classes, the Blue Oval race had seven-all XR2is and the Pre '83 thrash only six there is something wrong, championships need to be consolidated and whoever sanctioned that Pre 2005 series wants their head examining.

Having said all this the racing was excellent all afternoon and the sun shone. Some championships do get it right in terms of numbers, the Citroen 2CVs and Kumho BMWs have brought big grids this season and now it was the turn of the Legends.

The touring car races were all very close; a terrific Anglia/Mini Cortina scrap in the historics, a Sierra/Evo fight in Classic Thunder and a BMW rumble in Pre '93 and though the Pre '83 race only had six starters the lead scrap between Dolomite and Rover SD1 was thoroughly entertaining

Classic Formula Fords were also on the bill, plenty of them and including the types of cars that I saw on my first visit to Croft back in 1973! I love the old FF1600s and can't cope with the new wings and slicks version of the formula that I saw at the BTCC weekend. Typically, the racing was close and contained plenty of slipstreaming that the modern cars don't do.

I was home for 5.30, pretty well done in but what a day! Three events at a total entrance cost of just eighteen pounds plus under ten pounds worth of petrol. I'm fortunate that these types of events are on my doorstep and that I live somewhere that I can attend these events with relative ease
