It attracted relatively few competitors, which is a shame, as this event takes a lot of setting up and running. Let's hope that this year we can get a few more entries, as those who did enter thought it was a good event, although some of our members (no names Richard) came a bit unstuck, and Simon Higgs had his engine let go in a big way right in front of me - quite spectacular, but not as good as the F1 BMW (but they don't blow up, do they??)

Rockingham Stages 2005

Last month saw the Green Belt Marshalling Team assisting on this second year of the Middx County and Thame Motor Club event at this venue.

The Green Belt Crew of myself, Chris, Simon, Mark & Paul had a great time in the infield through out the day, bit of a Busman's Holiday if you know what I mean. The event would not seem as slick as the previous organised event, chicanes a little confusing?

Longmoor Loco Stages 2006

On a cold December the Green Belt Team ventured down the A3 to the Longmoor Military Camp for the 4th running of this event, to service for Ian & Simon Paul & Mark and Andrew and Paul. For whatever reason this normally popular event only attracted 51 crews.

The first couple of stages looked dry but were extremely slippery, although you would not think so looking at the pace from the top cars.

Stage two was not lucky to Andrew & Paul in their Escort 1300, on dropping the clutch the rear of the car went bang, back in the paddock it was diagnosed " no drive to the rear wheels"?. After getting the drive shafts out, it could only be the differential, with a pile of planet gears in the casing, the unit was U/S. The only way this unit was going to work was if the crown wheel and output shafts was completely welded together. Ian did a great job in welding the diff together, Ed and Andrew, in quick time rebuilt the axle, and the car was ready for stage 5. To my surprise the locked diff lasted the next two stages, on stage 7 I could see the black Escort stranded halfway in the stage. The car was towed back to the service area, on inspection the damage looked restricted to a broken steering arm, which was duly changed in no time. However the impact upon the wooden post had ripped the front anti-roll bar mount clean away from the chassis. With no time to fix it, it was retirement this time.

Mark & Paul Whitlock in their Peugeot had a steady run and survived with only a close encounter with a wall. I think the wall came out on top, only another head lamp???

Overall finished 29th and 8th in class.

Ian Barnard/ Simon Higgs Escort 2000 had another steady run, with his new Zetec 2 litre powered engine, had an incident free day and finished a creditable 14th overall and 4th in class.

Another well organised event by Sutton & Cheam Motor Club. Only one observation to make: making chicanes out of old wooden pallets is not very healthy, especially when they are struck by a fast moving object, wood splinters go everywhere.

New safety harness regulations for stage rally cars come into force on 1st January 2006. From that date it will be mandatory for safety harnesses to be FIA homologated. Harnesses are clearly identified by an FIA homologation label sewn into them near the release box. This label states: Not valid after [date]. Once this date has passed, the harness is no longer FIA homologated. All straps of a harness are labelled to identify them as being one set. The relevant regulation is K 37.8.3. for special stage rallies. Don't fail scrutineering at your 1st event in 2006! Make sure your belts are legal.

2006 will be the 53rd year of the Gold Star Rally Championship, the most prestigious title in UK Club Rallying. The Gold Star® Championship is open to all registered drivers / co-drivers and all vehicles with engines above 1400cc capacity. It includes the 7 vehicle classes shown below.

FIA Homologated Vehicles

Class N3: Group N over 1400cc up to and including 2000cc:

Class N4: Group N over 2000cc

Class A6: Group A over 1400cc up to and including 1600cc

All other vehicles that comply with the 2006 MSA Technical Regulations

Class B10: Over 1400cc up to and including 1600cc Class B11: Over 1600cc up to and including 2000cc Class B12: Over 2000cc two wheel drive Class B13: Over 2000cc four wheel drive


