Maximum number of events to count for the Trent Park Trophy remains at 15 events.

New safety harness regulations for stage rally cars come into force on 1st January 2006. From that date it will be mandatory for safety harnesses to be FIA homologated. Harnesses are clearly identified by an FIA homologation label sewn into them near the release box. This label states: Not valid after [date]. Once this date has passed, the harness is no longer FIA homologated. All straps of a harness are labelled to identify them as being one set. The relevant regulation is K 37.8.3. for special stage rallies. Don't fail scrutineering at your 1st event in 2006! Make sure your belts are legal.

2006 will be the 53rd year of the Gold Star Rally Championship, the most prestigious title in UK Club Rallying. The Gold Star® Championship is open to all registered drivers / co-drivers and all vehicles with engines above 1400cc capacity. It includes the 7 vehicle classes shown below.

Class N4: Group N over 2000cc

Class A6: Group A over 1400cc up to and including 1600cc

Viva Mexico !!!!!

Viva Mexico !!!!!

Robert Taylor once remarked to me, as we viewed scrutineering at the RAC rally, that there were cars there that he wouldn't venture down to the shops in.

Robert - you do not want to visit Mexico.

It is a jaw-dropping place to visit, from the moment that your 747 banks to port and you realise that the capital is entirely surrounded by mountains - and that every mountain has dwellings at least three-quarters of the way up its side. Well, all those Mexicans have to live somewhere.

To call it a macho country would be to state the blindingly obvious, yet to witness cars driven without seat belts, motorcycles ridden without helmets and children riding on the backs of pickup trucks and drink-driving is still disturbing.

I went up into the mountains with a Mexican family for Sunday dinner, all was very pleasant until I realised that our driver, who was buying the drinks , had had several beers, nobody else was on soft drinks and I was feeling slightly woozy, but drive home he did; on roads that used to host the Carrera Panamerica, in charge of a people carrier containing his wife, his mother-in-law, two sisters-in-law and one of said sister's English friend. How he got us home I have no idea, as he was well over our limit.

This is pretty typical of the country though, the car is king, Mexico City is moved by a huge fleet of VW Beetle taxis - public transport in the centre is pretty rudimentary.

There are long distance coaches, there is a Metro system in the capital, there are country bus services, but the car dominates.

Yet the car is unregulated, or so it appears; I saw no evidence of people learning to drive. When I asked all I got were very blank looks. Hardly surprising then that driving standards are abysmal, it seemed that few cars in the capital had an undamaged panel; no one indicates, drives to a safe distance, anticipates, lets anyone in, it is just, 'me me me' - as a taxi driver explained.

In fact I had the chance to join this madness, having viewed it through my hands in the backs of taxis, my friend's sister offered me her Chevy Nova (Vauxhall Corsa) for a couple of days, I declined, politely - 'don't join a game when you don't know the rules' was my thinking, though it took some explaining.

If drivers are not regulated then cars definitely are not. This is where I come to Robert's words because, though some vehicles are new - your Mexican loves his big truck, Chevy and Ford V8's provide wonderful music on the streets, accompanied by the constant hooting of car horns.

However, much, unsurprisingly, is not new. There are enough of the V8 muscle cars - Camaros, Mustangs, Toronados, Plymouths, and the rest for them not to stand out, but don't get too close, they all seem to be held together by string and chewing gum and all had bald tyres.

Inevitably these all seemed to be driven by the same type of macho young men who drove V8 pick-ups, but there were other types of cars - it seemed to be where Japanese cars of the early 1970's go to die. I saw many early Datsuns - built when Japanese cars weren't as good as they are now, 180B's and Cherries were the most popular, but all were extremely dilapidated, rusty, dented, worn, sagging. My friend Ana got sick of me looking for these up and down side roads in places like Leon and San Miguel - but I wanted to photograph the saddest example that I could find.


The Beetle is ubiquitous, it is still made in the country, though production is to end soon. The taxis are amazing, two doors, the driver shuts you in by means of pulling a piece of string, he then develops cancer because his diminutive workplace is at the level of every diesel exhaust pipe in the city. They scream around in huge herds, though guide books and websites are divided on their safety - because they only have two doors kidnapping is a real possibility, not that I personally had a bad experience, but then one of Ana's many cousins is a Beetle taxi driver! Naturally the Beetle is the weapon of choice for many non-macho citizens and I saw many in as bad a state as the Datsuns - but I will swear that I never saw a Datsun actually moving, unlike the VW's.

It is though, a wonderful country, even though every church has crippled, silent old beggar women outside the doors; even though they cannot cook any food except their own - I had the worst spaghetti Bolognese ever created anywhere, and that was in my hotel which was a Howard - Johnson. There is no subtlety about the country, at the pyramids (yes, the ones that featured in that mobile phone advert) there were dozens of souvenir sellers, great gangs of them, no matter that you had said 'no' to the last lot, on they came, 'you want buy signor ?', really quite annoying after you have politely declined half a dozen attempts already.

However, the women are mostly incredibly beautiful, the people are, by and large, friendly and proud - during the week of Independence Day the flag flies everywhere and they keep their own language and currency despite the presence of the USA.

But the driving and the cars.....

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
